## **Spring Meeting of the American Ethnological Society (AES), with the Society for Urban, National & Transnational Anthropology (SUNTA): "New Forms of Difference/New Forms of Connection" San Juan, PR ★ April 14-17, 2011**

Founded in 1842, the **American Ethnological Society (AES)** is the oldest and most important professional anthropological organization in the United States (with 4000 members), promoting research and scholarship in all aspects of ethnology. The **Society for Urban, National & Transnational Anthropology (SUNTA)** focuses on the interrelationships of urban, national and transnational processes as they affect peoples' everyday social and cultural lives in particular places.

This year's joint AES/SUNTA conference will bring together an international group of anthropologists, sociologists, scholars, researchers and ethnographers to discuss new forms of connection created by current political, social and economic conditions. Participants will examine topics as varied as the cultural politics of marginalization; 21<sup>st</sup>-century dimensions of race, class and gender; new political and social movements; biopolitics and health; language practices and identities; immigration; neocolonialism; the state's role in militarization, criminalization and violence; anthropology and history; and new directions for anthropological research. **This is one of the most exciting anthropology meetings of 2011.**

**The 2011 Keynote Speaker** is **Frances Fox Piven**, Professor of Sociology & Political Science, CUNY Graduate Center, best known for two pioneering books: *Regulating the Poor* and *Poor People's Movements*. In recent years, she has turned her attention to Americans' electoral participation. Her most recent books are *Challenging Authority* and *Keeping Down the Black Vote*. **Presidential Addresses** will be given by **Jane Collins** (Professor of Sociology, University of Wisconsin, Madison), whose research interests include gender, culture, and economic change and development, and **Don Nonini** (Professor of Anthropology, UNC Chapel Hill), who writes on the cultural politics of ethnicity/race, class and gender, with special interest in the Southern US and East Asia.
