## 2011 Conference and Annual Meeting of the Society for U.S. Intellectual History (S-USIH): "Narratives" CUNY Graduate Center, New York, NY ★ November 17-18, 2011

The S-USIH conference promotes the interdisciplinary discussion of American intellectual history, fostering connections between scholars who share an interest in the ideas, institutions and thinkers who have influenced American political, scientific and cultural life. This year's meeting will focus on how narratives—essential to the study of American thought—are constructed, catalogued and interpreted, and how they relate to other forms of expression such as argument or declaration.
