SLSA promotes the study, teaching of southern labor and working class history, provides resources for teachers and promotes the preservation of historical materials. Their biennial conference brings together labor activists and academics to exchange scholarship and experiences. The 2011 conference will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the Southern Labor Archives at Georgia State University, examining how it shapes and constrains the meaning of labor, the worker and the working class.

This year's Keynote Speakers are Robert Korstad (Professor of Public Policy and History, Duke University; author of *To Right These Wrongs*); and Alessandro Portelli (Professor of Anglo-American Literature, University of Rome La Sapienza; author of *They Say in Harlan County*).
