AMSA advances the critical study of men and masculinities by encouraging teaching, research and clinical practice in the field of men's studies. Their inclusive, interdisciplinary conference brings together scholars, clinicians and activists engaged with men and masculinities as social-historical constructions. Topics range from power, patriarchy and hierarchy to literature, historical studies, gay men's experiences, the relationship of men's studies to feminism, and religion. **The 2012 conference will examine the history of men's studies, the state of research in the field, and new areas of study that will further enhance our understanding of the variety of masculinities.**

PLENARY SPEAKERS INCLUDE: **Harry Brod (Professor of Philosophy, University of Northern Iowa):** One of the founders of Men's Studies and a spokesperson for the pro-feminist men's movement, Brod moved the field from a monolithic understanding of "masculinity" to recognizing the diversity of men and masculinities across racial, social and other divides. His most recent book is *Brother Keepers: New Perspectives on Jewish Masculinity* (Men's Studies Press); and **Shaun Harper (Director of the Center for the Study of Race & Equity in Education, University of Pennsylvania):** AMSA's Scholar-in-Residence examines race and gender in higher education, Black male college access and achievement, and college student engagement. His most recent book is *College Men & Masculinities: Theory, Research & Implications for Practice* (Jossey Bass).
